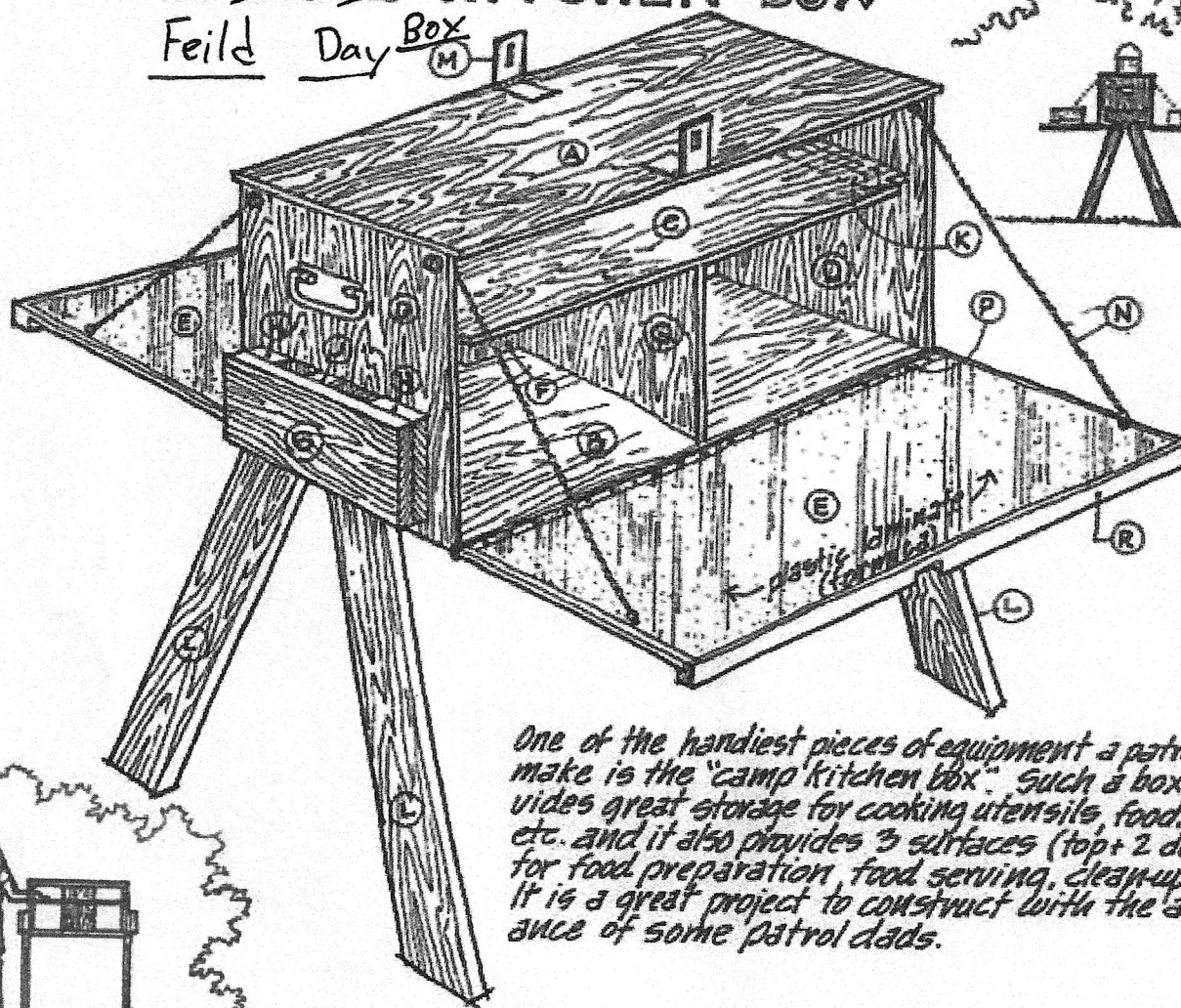

Feild Day Box

Such a box provides great storage for cooking utensils, food, spices, etc. and it also provides 3 surfaces (top + 2 doors) for food preparation, food serving, clean-up, etc. It is a great project to construct with the assistance of some patrol dads.

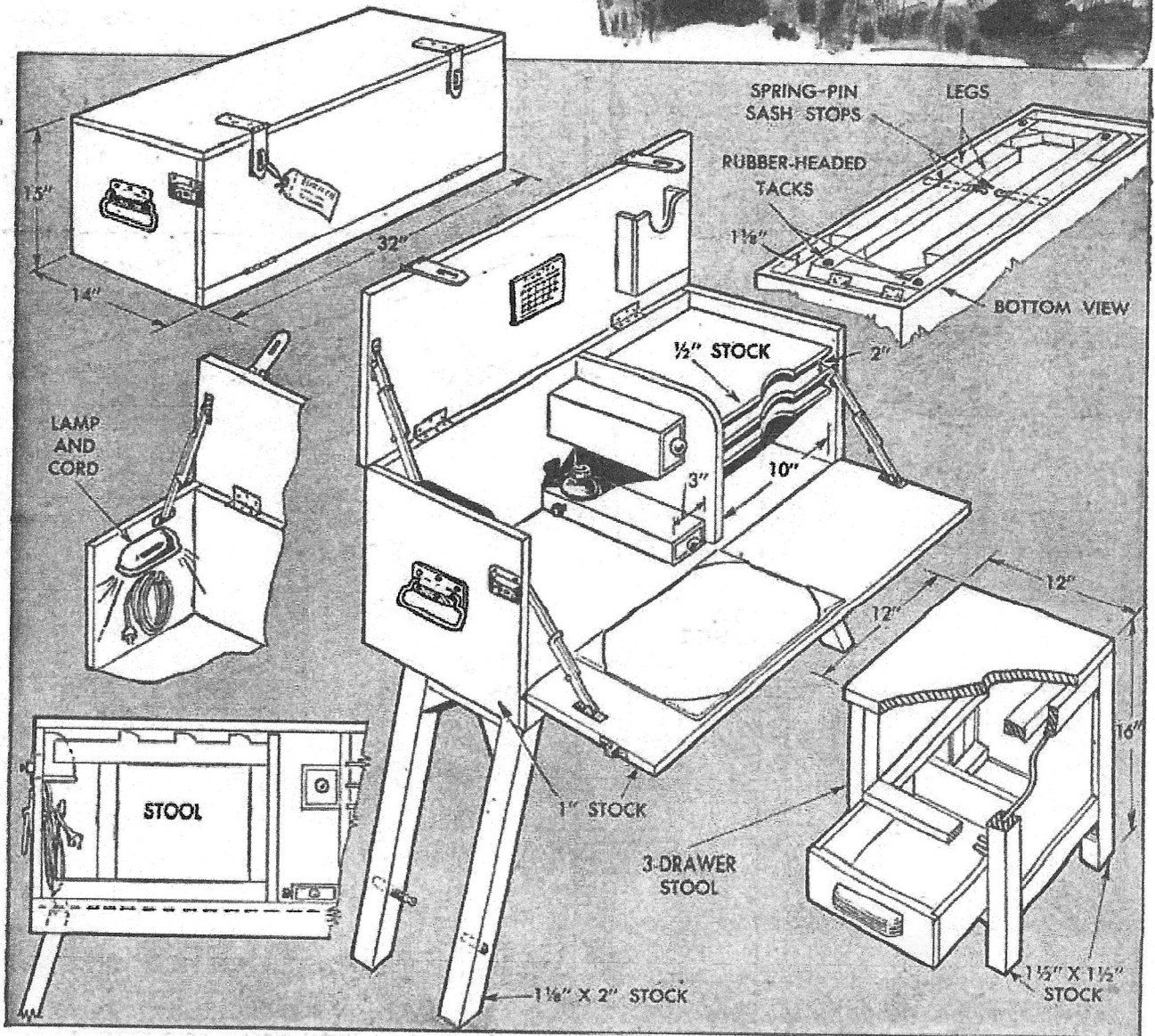
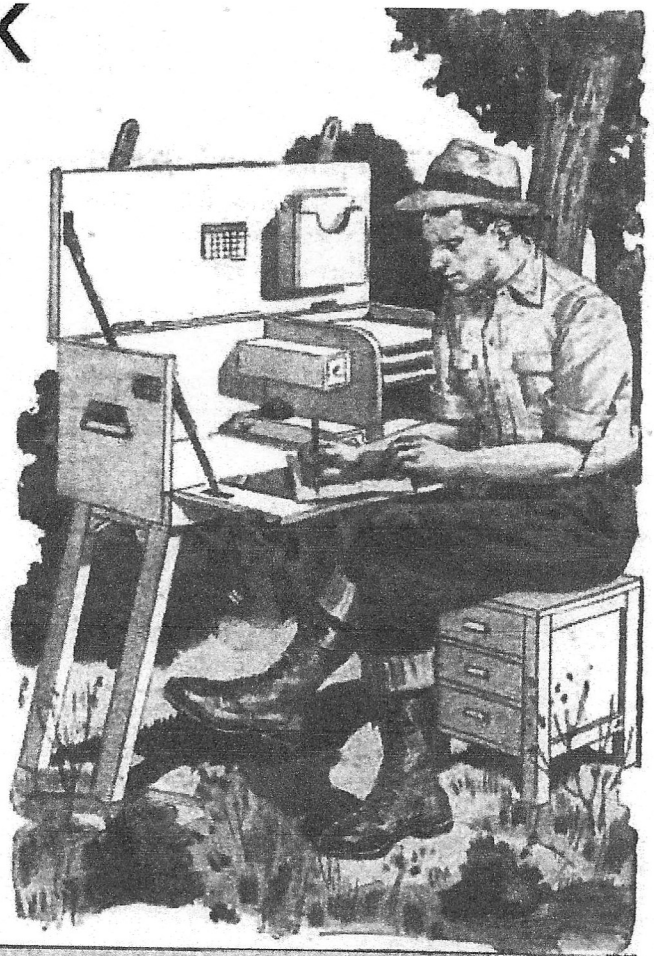

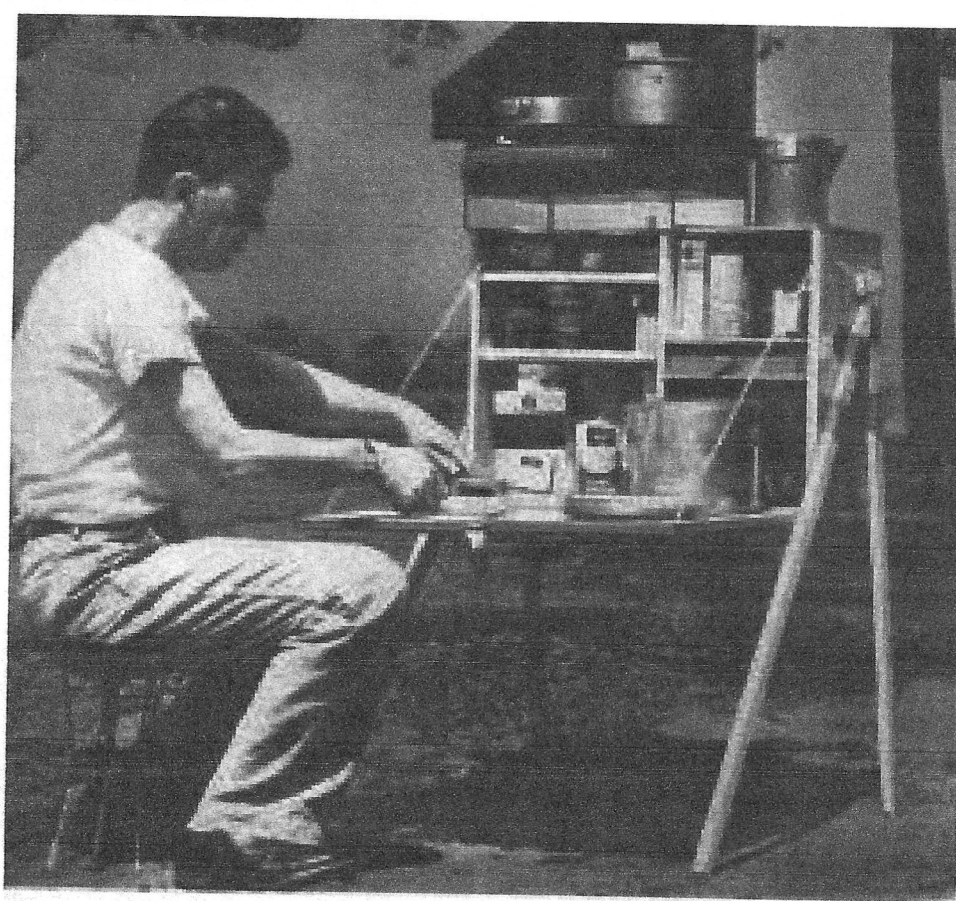

| C - 1 Shelf: 15 1/4" x 31 1/4" x 3/8" A/C Plywood | R - 2 Door Stiffeners: 3/4" x 3/4" x 32" y. pine |
| D - 2 Ends: 15 1/4" x 15 5/8" x 3/8" A/C Plywood | 50 - CS wood screws #6 - 1 1/4" long |
| E - 2 Doors: 15 1/4" x 32" x 3/8" A/C Plywood | 20 - CS wood screws #4 - 1" long |

OUTDOOR DESK

IDEAL for the naturalist, archaeologist or anyone who must do documentary work in the field, this folding desk-and-stool combination provides substantial writing surface along with comparative comfort. The desk folds into a compact case for traveling. In addition to containing all the essential writing equipment, it also carries the three-drawer stool. Shelves, together with the stool drawers, afford ample space for storing paper, records and reference books. Two small drawers at the center partition hold pencils, pens, etc. A bottle of ink is inserted in a hole cut in the lower drawer and is held by means of a thumbscrew. A lamp, which can be connected to a portable power supply, is attached as shown. In this location, the lamp will furnish sufficient illumination and still not interfere with packing of the stool. The desk legs fold for carrying and are held folded by spring sash stops.



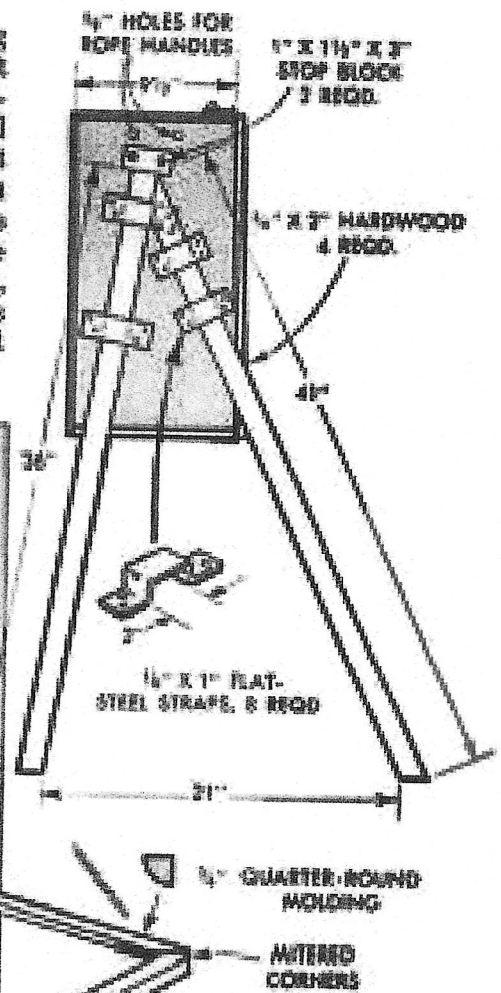
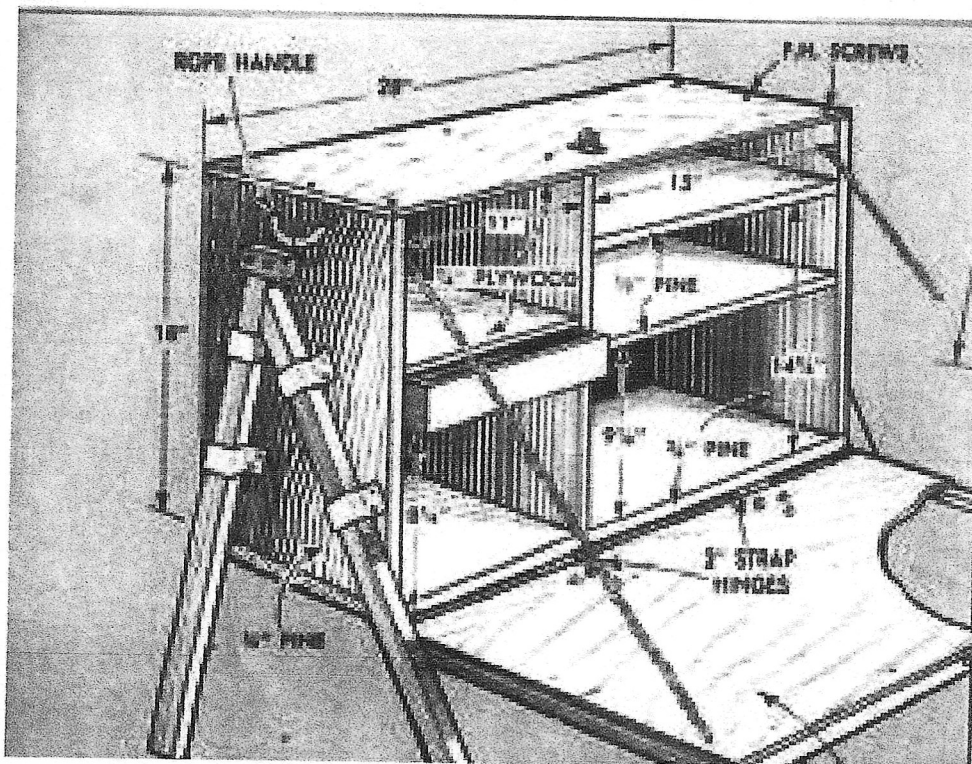


CAMPER'S CABINET KITCHEN

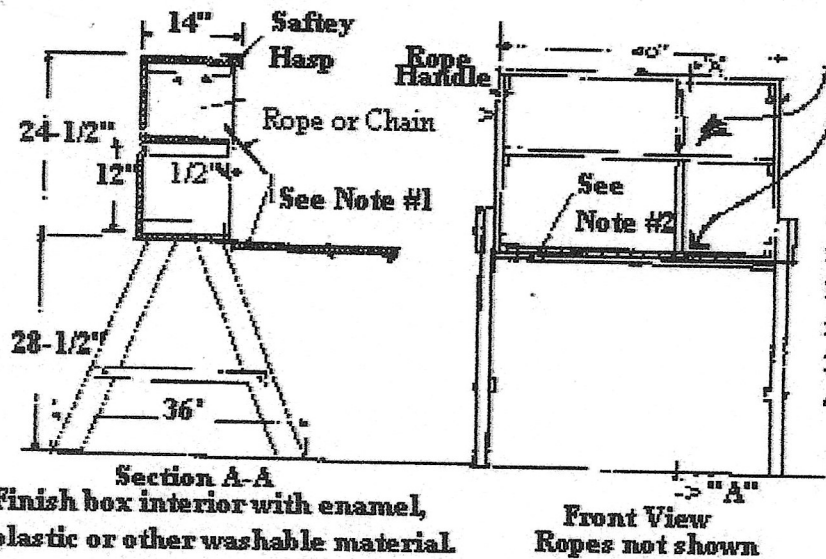

Being the camp cook is a real pleasure when everything you need is right at your finger tips. Note how the hinged front of the portable cabinet opens to provide a worktable at a convenient height.

THERE WAS A TIME when camping out meant roughing it, and eating camp food was a test of endurance. That picture has changed considerably and camping has become the art of living as comfortably as possible under all kinds of conditions. For family camping, this compact portable kitchen will provide the answer to the problem of a place for everything. It also can be used by hunters and fishermen who are going to spots that are accessible by car. The cabinet is designed to hold a cooking kit, eating utensils, and enough canned and dehydrated foods to feed six people for a week. Removable legs make it easy to stow the cabinet in the trunk of your car.

ASSEMBLY

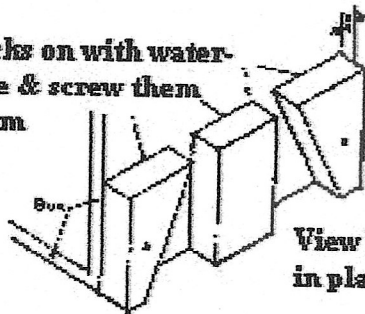
- 1) Attach tie braces to legs but do not tighten wing nuts.
- 2) Loosen wing nuts on clamp plates (plates, once installed remain on box)
- 3) Insert legs in sockets and tighten wing nuts.
- 4) Tighten tie braces

To disassemble, reverse above procedure.

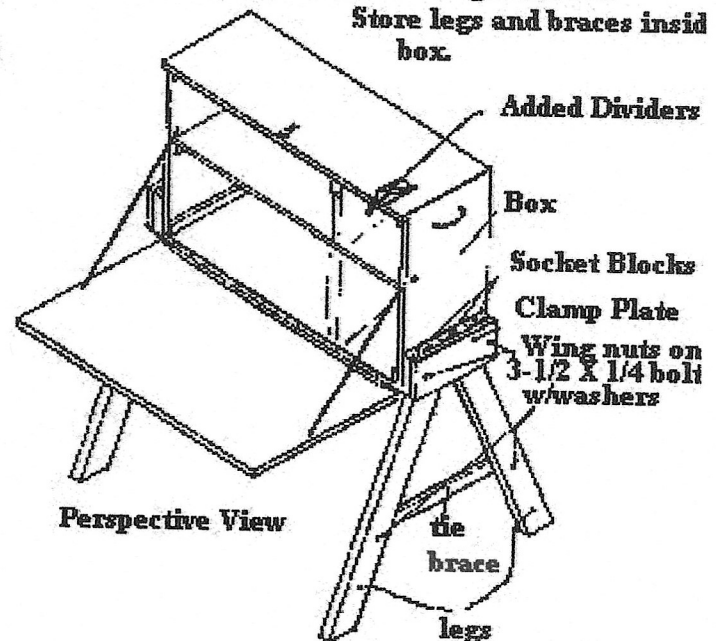
Store legs and braces inside box.

Make Box of 3/4" Plywood

Glue blocks on with waterproof glue & screw them to box from inside.



View of Socket Blocks in place on Box End



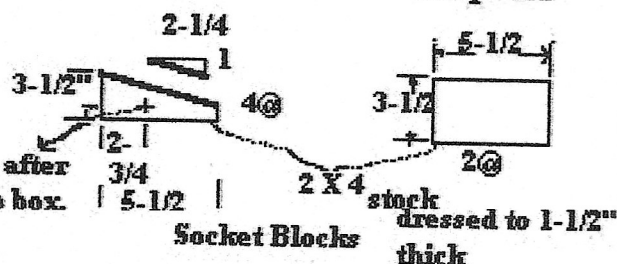
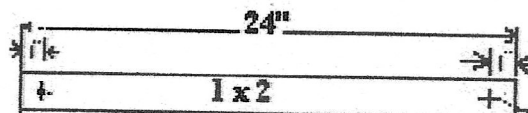
Perspective View

Note #1

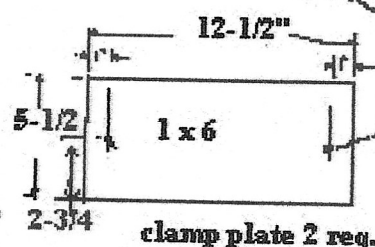
Lid may be lined with hardboard, plastic laminate, sheet metal or other cutting surface.

Note #2

Use 1" heavy duty continuous hinge



Drill this hole after gluing block to box.



Holes for 1/4" bolt

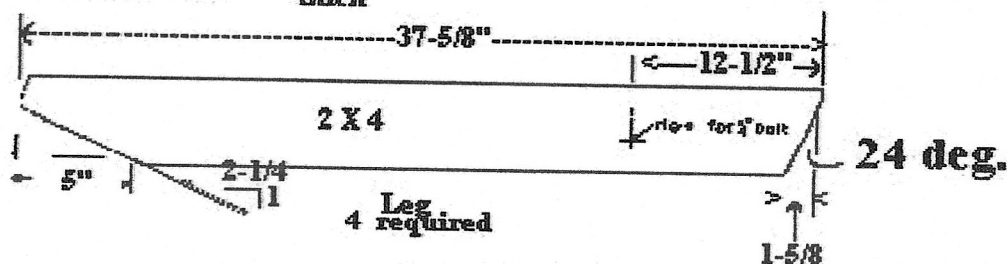
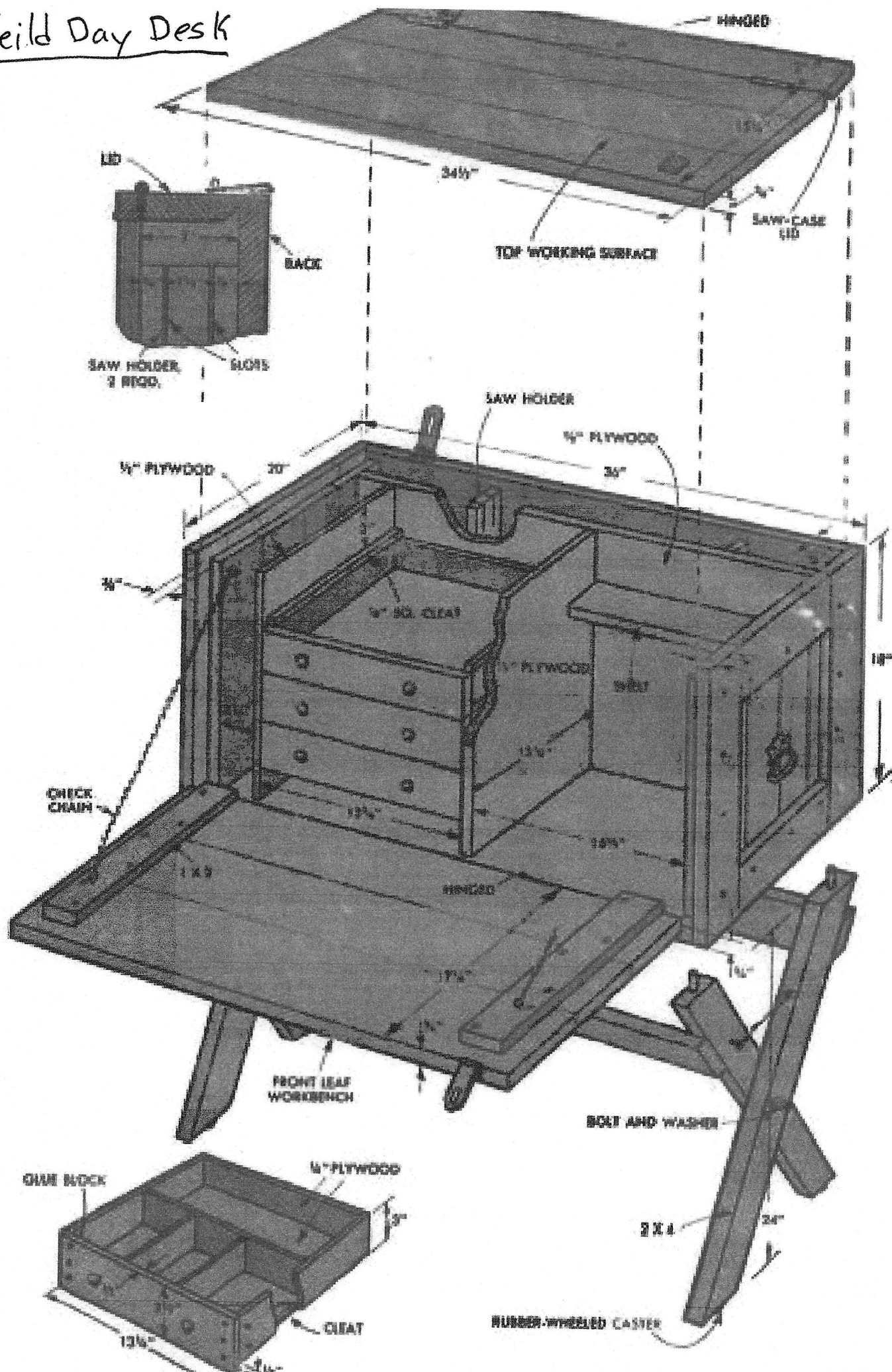
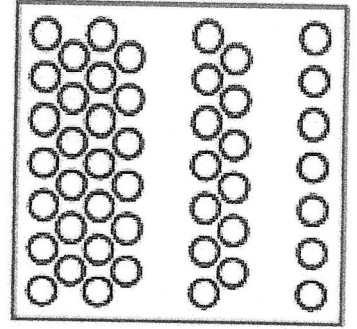
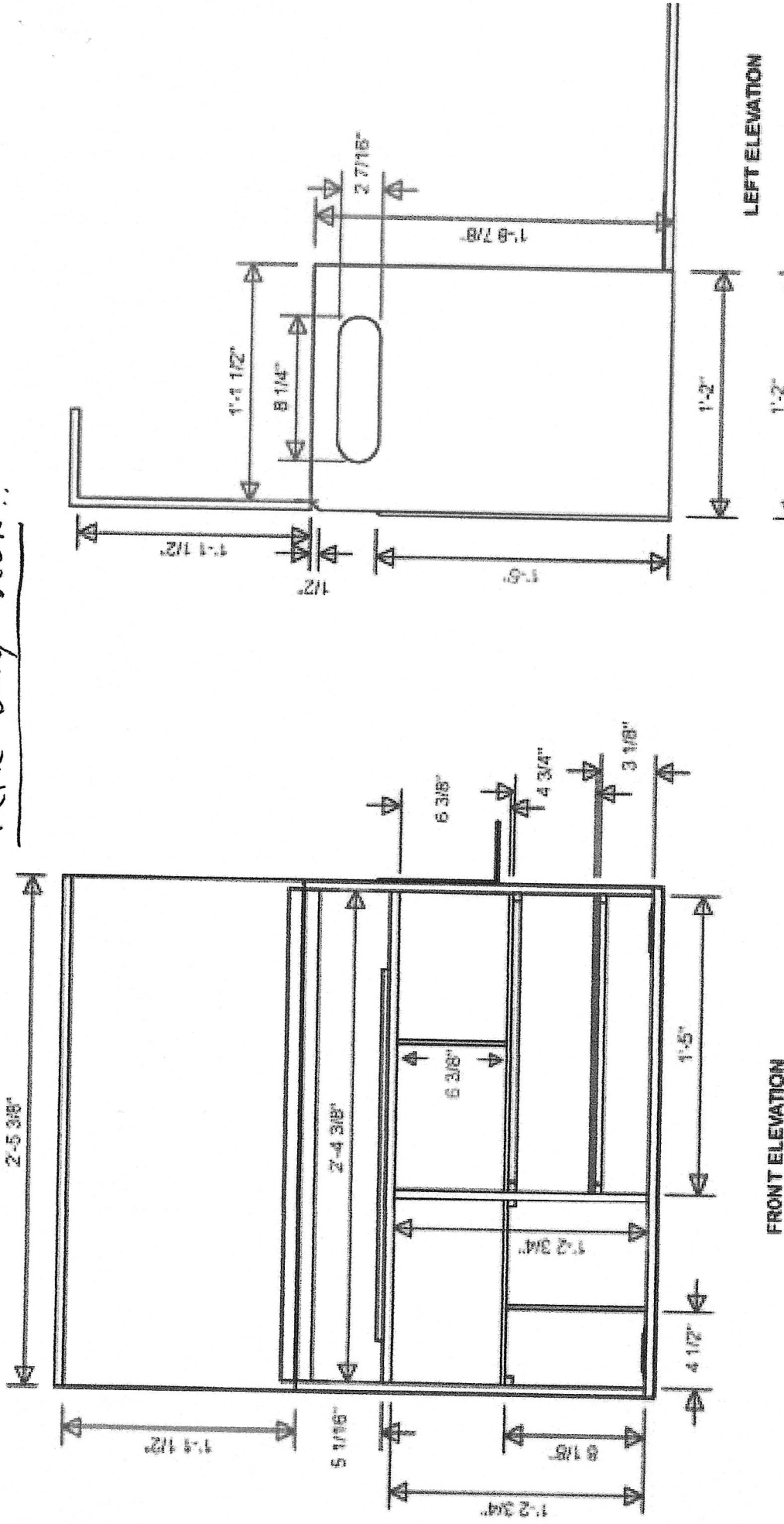


Figure 50.--- Patrol Food Chest
